

Dear Calvary folks,

It feels to me right now like an alternate name for the Easter Season could be the "Now What?" Season.

The initial gospel lessons on and after Easter Sunday seem primarily to consist of shocked reactions and wondering and what comes next. The exclamation in our Easter declaration, "Christ is risen!" could easily be changed into a question: "Christ is risen?" The answer is "Yes! Hallelujah!"

Perhaps that affirmation to the wonder of Easter is why I love to have that exchange in worship. "Christ is Risen!" "He is risen indeed! Hallelujah!" I've said it more than once, it never gets old!

So yes, once we get used to the idea of Christ being resurrected, once the truth seeps once again into our bones, once we proclaim Jesus' resurrection without absolute surprise in our voices, then we come to the "Now What?"

One option is to live more fully into peace in our lives, to release that common anxiety that most of us deal with as a buzzing background. We can become more sure of God's love for us, more ready to confront difficult problems, more likely to seek out other company.

Another option is to have more conversations with our friends about the things that matter. Our college friends Ruth and John just came for an overnight in the Stein-Webber hotel. We ate and we talked. We cooked and did puzzles and talked. We sang songs and talked. And we walked, braved the wind by Morro Rock, and, you guessed it, we talked.

There's something about Easter that gets people talking.

And a third option in the face of Easter is to go beyond our friendship circle and talk with people who we meet or are drawn to our days running about. We can spread good cheer, provide an unexpected listening ear, give reason for the hope that is within us.

Young people I listen to call these encounters "random". Such as "I was talking with this random person..." It sounds as if we run into said "random" person as a matter of chance.

But I, and probably you, think that, as Easter people, our third option above involves more than randomness. It involves the movement of the Holy Spirit, bringing us into contact with certain people at certain times and in certain places.

We can sing that favorite hymn, "Lead me, guide me, along the way." And then we might realize that even before we sing it, God is busy leading all kinds of people along their ways, and hoping that the children of God (that's us!) would stop and talk with those people God is sending across our paths.

You know what I mean? I know you do. And you're doing it in Jesus' name, for the sake of the good news!
