**FIRST LESSON: Isaiah 58:9b-14**

The first lesson for Eleventh Sunday after Pentecost is from the book of Isaiah, the 58<sup>th</sup> chapter, beginning with the second half of the 9<sup>th</sup> verse.

God's Message:

“If you get rid of unfair practices, quit blaming victims,  
quit gossiping about other people's sins,  
if you are generous with the hungry  
and start giving yourselves to the down-and-out,  
your lives will begin to glow in the darkness,  
your shadowed lives will be bathed in sunlight.

I will always show you where to go.  
I'll give you a full life in the emptiest of places – firm muscles, strong bones.  
You'll be like a well-watered garden, a gurgling spring that never runs dry.  
You'll use the old rubble of past lives to build anew,  
rebuild the foundations from out of your past.  
You'll be known as those who can fix anything,  
restore old ruins, rebuild and renovate, make the community livable again.

“If you watch your step on the Sabbath  
and don't use my holy day for personal advantage,  
if you treat the Sabbath as a day of joy, God's holy day as a celebration,  
if you honor it by refusing 'business as usual, making money,  
running here and there –  
then you'll be free to enjoy God!  
Oh, I'll make you ride high and soar above it all.  
I'll make you feast on the inheritance of your ancestors  
Jacob and Leah and Rachel.”

**SECOND READING: Hebrews 12:18-29**

The Second Reading for this Eleventh Sunday after Pentecost is from the 12<sup>th</sup> chapter of Hebrews, beginning with the 18<sup>th</sup> verse.

Unlike your ancestors, you didn't come to Mount Sinai –  
all that volcanic blaze and earthshaking rumble –  
to hear God speak.  
The earsplitting words and soul-shaking message terrified them

and they begged God to stop.  
When they heard the words – “If an animal touches the Mountain, it’s as good as dead” –  
they were afraid to move.  
Even Moses was terrified.

No, that’s not *your* experience at all.  
You’ve come to Mount Zion, the city where the living God resides.  
The invisible Jerusalem is populated by throngs of festive angels and Christian citizens.  
It is the city where God is Judge, with judgments that make us just.  
You’ve come to Jesus, who presents us with a new covenant.  
He is the Mediator of this covenant.  
The murder of Jesus, unlike Abel’s – a homicide that cried out for vengeance –  
became a proclamation of grace.

So don’t turn a deaf ear to these gracious words.  
If those who ignored earthly warnings didn’t get away with it,  
what will happen to us if we turn our backs on heavenly warnings?  
God’s voice that time shook the earth to its foundations;  
this time – God’s told us this quite plainly – God will also rock the heavens:  
“One last shaking, from top to bottom, stem to stern.”  
The phrase “one last shaking” means a thorough housecleaning,  
getting rid of all the historical and religious junk  
so that the unshakable essentials stand clear and uncluttered.

Do you see what we’ve got?  
An unshakable kingdom!  
And do you see how thankful we must be?  
Not only thankful, but brimming with worship, deeply reverent before God.  
For God is not an indifferent bystander.  
God is actively cleaning house, torching all that needs to burn,  
and God won’t quit until it’s all cleansed.  
God indeed is Fire!
