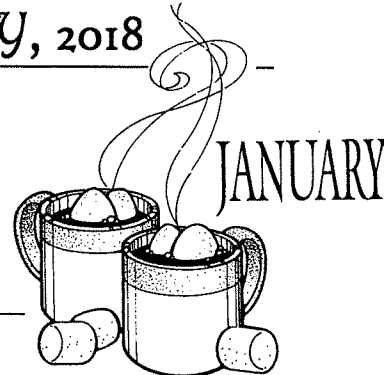

As we enter a new year the Bible passage that comes to my mind is Revelation 21:1-7. There we read:

Then I saw "a new heaven and a new earth," for the first heaven and the first earth had passed away, and there was no longer any sea. I saw the Holy City, the new Jerusalem, coming down out of heaven from God, prepared as a bride beautifully dressed for her husband. And I heard a loud voice from the throne saying, "Look! God's dwelling place is now among the people, and he will dwell with them. They will be his people, and God himself will be with them and be their God. 'He will wipe every tear from their eyes. There will be no more death' or mourning or crying or pain, for the old order of things has passed away." He who was seated on the throne said, "I am making everything new!" Then he said, "Write this down, for these words are trustworthy and true." He said to me: "It is done. I am the Alpha and the Omega, the Beginning and the End. Church Council

The Congregational Council met December 13th for their annual Christmas Dinner and meeting. After a wonderful potluck meal, Sharron Jackman shared a devotion and Pastor led us in prayer. After reviewing minutes and finances we moved on for some discussion of future Council officers. A formal decision will be made next month. We talked about the Iglesia "Angel Tree" project and the good response we had to this. We also talked about coming up with a way to appreciate a few of our key volunteers. This is in process and will be done in the near future. We also discussed future financial needs and fundraising opportunities. After reviewing a few coming events, especially Lent beginning on February 14th the meeting was adjourned with the Lord's Prayer.

New Council members for 2018 are Gail Brochtrup, Steve Glabere, and Georgiana Tway. They will join Beth Davis, Barbara Dilts, Barbara Hawgiwara, Sharron Jackman, Maggie Muff, Nancy Padilla, and Randy Schuldt in January.

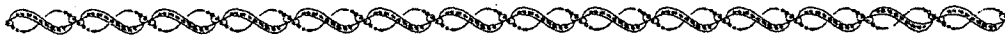
Others individually elected at Annual Meeting, Part 1 were:

- Endowment Fund Committee – Bruce Torgerson joins returning members: Brenda Ouwerkerk and Darel Sorensen
- Audit Committee for 2018 will be Joe Hoeflich, Gary Orback, and Cindy Haener

Other items from the Annual Meeting include

- Approval of the Budget for 2018 with a 2% salary increase
- Approval of sending \$500 of interest money earned in 2017 from the Mission Endowment Fund to Iglesia Santa Cruz in Santa Maria.
- Using \$7,700 from the Endowment Fund interest earned in 2017 to support the 2018 congregational budget as well as use up to \$20,000 from principle if necessary.

Annual Meeting, Part 2 will be Sunday, January 21 following the worship service. At this meeting we will receive the reports of the congregation.



IT IS STILL CHRISTMAS!

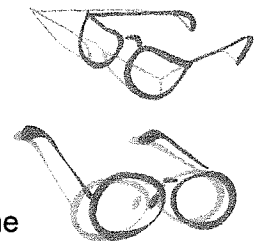
WE COLLECT...

Sunday, January 14th

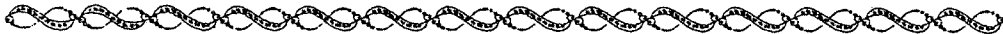
Lesson: What is the New Testament?

Craft: Mason Jar Lamps with Sand, Salt and Candles

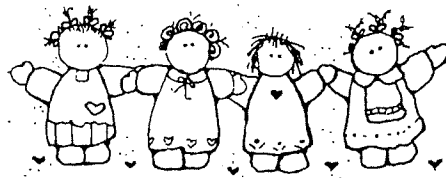

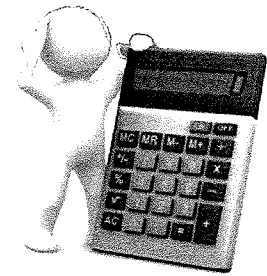


SUNDAY SCHOOL STEWARDSHIP PROJECT NEWS

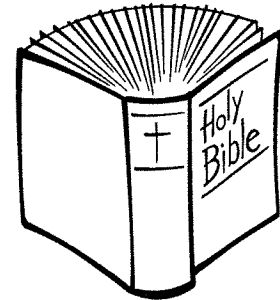

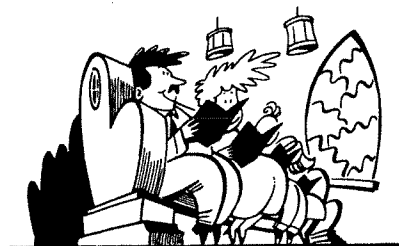

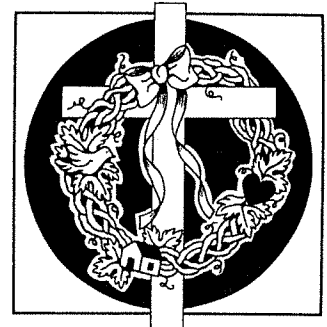
